

EASO in the Western Balkan region

Key features and drivers of EASO's engagement

- A combined regional and national approach
- Selected thematic areas on asylum and reception characterized by a clear addedvalue, efficiency in resource allocation and buy-in and ownership from the WB partners
- Capacity development vs capacity substitution
- Peer to peer approach (EU+ national system expertise)
- EU accession perspective (EU enlargement policy)
- Team Europe delivering as one by coordinating and facilitating EU+ support, including with partner EU agencies (FTX) and other int. partners (IOM, UNHCR, CoE)



Identified priorities for EASO support in the field of asylum and reception





Regional priorities

- Facilitating exchange of practices with peers across the region and with the EU;
- Dissemination of EASO tools and guides
 - WB COI practitioners' network
 - Expanding professional development opportunities
 - Age assessment procedures

Bilateral cooperation with Western Balkans

Targeted, national cooperation frameworks with tailored activities meeting the specific needs of the national administrations, addressing EU accession priorities (Chapter 24 Action Plans)

- Contributing to the reinforcement of asylum related legislation, institutions and systems
- Contributing to effective asylum procedures
- Contributing to an effective reception system
